Election Information

WISCONSIN REQUIRES A PHOTO ID TO VOTE

Voter Registration. You can check to see if you are registered to vote, update your name or address or register to vote online at <https://myvote.wi.gov/en-us/RegisterToVote>. MyVote is available in both English and Spanish. For more information or to find a Voter Registration Form go to the town's website at <https://townoftroy.org/election-information/>

Absentee Voting. In Wisconsin, you do not need a reason to vote absentee. For this Election we will be offering extended hours to allow more people to vote absentee. Please remember that even if you vote absentee, you must show an acceptable form of photo identification. The additional in-person hours are listed below.

There are a number of ways you can request an absentee ballot, the easiest way is to visit (<https://myvote.wi.gov/>) and click on Vote Absentee. You will need to complete the requested information. Once you are registered to vote in the Town of Troy, you can also send your absentee request by email or US mail. All you need to do is provide us with the date of the election, your name, your mailing address. You must include a copy of a valid photo ID with your request. Planning to Burn?

Complete a permit application at the Town Hall or Town Recycling Center during business hours. The Town Hall is open 9 am to 12:30 pm Monday through Thursday.

It is important to call St Croix County Dispatch number before burning. If you live near the Pierce – St Croix County line, also call the Pierce County Sheriff business number. Both numbers are on the permit. Most of the Troy Burning Permit Ordinance is on the backside of your burn permit. Read and become familiar with it, especially with what permit holder duties are.

It is equally important to have the phone with you that you give to dispatch, in case a call is received by dispatch from a passerby who believes your fire is out of control or unattended. If you do not answer your phone and report that you are monitoring the burn and it is under control, a fire truck and fire crew will arrive. The cost for such a call is a minimum of \$800.

Please take precautions when burning in spring. Dead winter weeds and grasses are very combustible and can get out of control quickly, especially if it is windy. Avoid burning on a windy day.

Spring is a good time to remember your obligation as a homeowner to maintain a minimum overhead clearance of 14 feet above the width and length of your driveway to allow emergency vehicles, entry in the event of a fire or medical emergency. (Refer to Ordinance, Roads and Driveways, Chapter 125, 125-6 Specifications D, Driveway Clearance.)

Hudson Fire has purchased a landing watercraft with a bow drop down to facilitate EMS and Fire personnel and equipment access to rivers, waterways and waterfront property, not only to extinguish a fire but also for an emergency rescue.

Town of Troy Park Board

It is the mission of the Park Board to plan, acquire, develop and maintain parkland and to provide the citizens of Troy with a park system for the conservation, preservation and enjoyment of their natural environment and the recreational facilities provided. The Park Board citizen members are appointed by the Town Board from interested residents of Troy for a 3-year term (2 appointments each year).

Parks & Recreation Update

Recent Glover Park improvements include:

A new pavilion that features a community kitchen and restrooms, restored trails (Eagle, Eagle Pass, Red Tail), and new pickleball courts. The restrooms are open from spring through mid-November. Portable restrooms are in place during the winter months. Pavilions and community kitchen can be reserved by contacting the Clerk's office. Pickleball courts are available on a "first come" basis, and visitors need to bring rackets and balls.

Bike/pedestrian routes which connect to Hudson and River Falls are marked with new signs, in conjunction with county wide trail system. A subcommittee composed of Park Board and citizen members is working to improve routes and add additional paths in the future.






