## **From the Desk of Chair Rowen**

In 2026, the Town of Troy is moving to the implementation phase of a number of initiatives that have been in planning for the last few years.

- **Fire Service Optimization:** With the construction and staffing of the Troy Fire Substation (managed by the Hudson Fire Department) we will bring over 80% of Troy properties within 5 driving miles of a fire station and increase capacity in the region. Primary response boundaries will change in January 2027 to enhance overall support from both the Hudson and River Falls Fire Departments.
- **Disposal Center Expansion and Relocation:** Doubling the size for better flow and capacity for more residents, improving staff efficiency and operations, reducing heavy truck traffic on Town roads (extending life span).
- **Enhanced Road Maintenance Planning:** Town-wide analysis of all 94 miles of roads in the Town to target both preventative maintenance and reconstruction projects to minimize cost, maximize road surface quality, and optimize potential for grant funding.
- **Cooperative Boundary Agreement:** Proposed with the City of Hudson to give the Town more control over how annexation is implemented, limit the types of development that can be done in Town territory, and enhance landowners rights to develop under Town of Troy standards. Protecting the character we all value for the long term.

At least once a month I host informal discussions at the Town Hall on any topics of interest to residents. Many thanks to those who have taken the time to share their perspectives and discuss topics, both large and small. 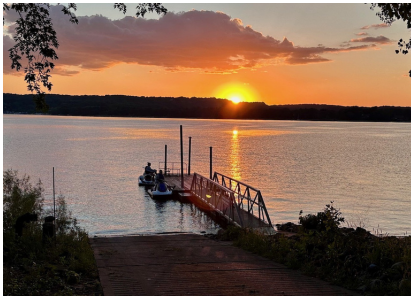

Annual permit Parking: 12 Spaces



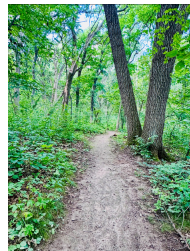
Glover Park Location: 428 Glover Road

## PLANNING TO BURN?

### OBTAIN YOUR BURNING PERMIT AT THE TOWN HALL OR DISPOSAL CENTER

Complete a permit application at the Town Hall or Town Disposal Center during business hours. The Town Hall is open 9 am to 2:00 pm Monday through Thursday. It is important to call St Croix County Dispatch number before burning. If you live near the Pierce – St Croix County line, also call the Pierce County Sheriff business number. Both numbers are on the permit. Most of the Troy Burning Permit Ordinance is on the backside of your burn permit.

Read and become familiar with it, especially with what permit holder duties are. It is equally important to have the phone with you that you give to dispatch, in case a call is received by dispatch from a passerby who believes your fire is out of control or unattended. If you do not answer your phone and report that you are monitoring the burn and it is under control, a fire truck and fire crew will arrive. The cost for such a call is a minimum of \$800.
